"'Rest' (katapausis), as used here, points to a place of blessing where there is no more striving but only relaxation in the presence of God and in the certainty that there is no cause for fear." Thomas Constable Commentary

- Psalm 23:2 He leads me beside *still* waters
- Isaiah 11:10 His rest shall be glorious
- Isaiah 32:18 Dwelling in quiet resting places
