Bearing One Another's Burdens

Exodus 17:12 But Moses' hands became heavy; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. And Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun.

Galatians 6:2 Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

Galatians 6:10 Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith.

Hebrews 6:10 For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that <u>you have ministered to the saints</u>, and do minister.

1 Thessalonians 2:7-8 But we were gentle among you, just as a nursing mother cherishes her own children. So, affectionately longing for you, <u>we were well pleased to impart to you not only the gospel of God, but also our own lives</u>, because you had become dear to us.

John 15:13 Greater love has no one than this, than to <u>lay down one's life for his friends</u>.

1 Corinthians 12:25-26 that there should be no schism in the body, but that <u>the members should have</u> <u>the same care for one another</u>. And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it.

Romans 15:1-2 We then who are strong ought to <u>bear with the weaknesses of the weak</u>, and not to please ourselves. Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, leading to edification.

James 2:14-17 What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him? If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you says to them, "Depart in peace, be warmed and filled," but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit? Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

Romans 12:4-5 For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another.

Ephesians 4:2-4 with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, <u>bearing with one another in love,</u> <u>endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace</u>. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling;

Philippians 2:3-4 Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others.

Colossians 3:12-15 Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful.

- **1 Peter 4:8-10** And above all things <u>have fervent love for one another</u>, for "love will cover a multitude of sins." <u>Be hospitable to one another without grumbling</u>. As each one has received a gift, <u>minister it to one another</u>, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
- **1 Peter 3:8** Finally, all of you be of one mind, <u>having compassion for one another</u>; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous;
