Friendship

- "Friendship is unnecessary, like philosophy, like art ... It has no survival value; rather it is one of those things which give value to survival." C.S Lewis Four Loves
- "In friendship...we think we have chosen our peers. In reality a few years' difference in the dates of our births, a few more miles between certain houses, the choice of one university instead of another...the accident of a topic being raised or not raised at a first meeting--any of these chances might have kept us apart. But, for a Christian, there are, strictly speaking, no chances. A secret master of ceremonies has been at work. Christ, who said to the disciples, 'Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you,' can truly say to every group of Christian friends, 'Ye have not chosen one another but I have chosen you for one another.' The friendship is not a reward for our discriminating and good taste in finding one another out. It is the instrument by which God reveals to each of us the beauties of others." Lewis

Jonathan and David

- **1 Samuel 18:1-3** Now when he had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. Saul took him that day, and would not let him go home to his father's house anymore. Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he loved him as his own soul.
- **1 Samuel 19:1** but Jonathan, Saul's son, delighted greatly in David.
- **1 Samuel 20:4** So Jonathan said to David, "Whatever you yourself desire, I will do it for you."
- **1 Samuel 20:17** Now Jonathan again caused David to vow, because he loved him; for he loved him as he loved his own soul.
- **1 Samuel 20:41-42** As soon as the lad had gone, David arose from a place toward the south, fell on his face to the ground, and bowed down three times. And they kissed one another; and they wept together, but David more so. Then Jonathan said to David, "Go in peace, since we have both sworn in the name of the Lord, saying, 'May the Lord be between you and me, and between your descendants and my descendants, forever.'
- **1 Sam 23:16, 18** Then Jonathan, Saul's son, arose and went to David in the woods and <u>strengthened</u> (<u>encouraged</u>) <u>his hand in God</u>. So the two of them made a covenant before the Lord. And David stayed in the woods, and Jonathan went to his own house.

2 Samuel 1:25-26 "How the mighty have fallen in the midst of the battle! Jonathan was slain in your high places. I am distressed for you, my brother Jonathan; <u>You have been very pleasant to me</u>; <u>Your love to me was wonderful, surpassing the love of women.</u>

Jesus as Friend

John 15:13-15 Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you.
